How to File a Complaint – Violation of Use Permit: Winery Events and Daily Food Service

Citizen/ Neighbor Monitoring – Complaint required before County Enforcement – STEPS to register a request for Code Compliance investigation below <u>Process requires Sign In on SoCo Connect</u> > County Website with links

County does not accept anonymous complaints. You may request your name and contact information be kept confidential (which will **not be disclosed unless court ordered** by a judge). To make a code violation complaint regarding suspected building, zoning, cannabis, grading, or well & septic issues: or **Winery Use Permit Violation.**

First: Gather information about violation: TIME/DATED: Pictures of parking lot or cars parked on street, AUDIO of amplified music from your property line, VIDEO of parking lot noise, Construction of kitchen/ dining facilities without a Modified Use Permit (building permit not sufficient). NOTE: If noise is after 10 pm, notify the Sheriff to close party down: <u>Sheriff's Department</u>

Have ADDRESS or PARCEL NUMBER of the property- must be in County - unincorporated SoCo:

- Check that there isn't already an open violation. Use our <u>Permit</u> <u>History Lookup Tool</u> to search by a property's address or by parcel number. Review all Permits – is there an active or approved permit – does Use Permit list the activities?
- 2. **Report the problem with SoCo Connect** select "**Code Compliance**." Please provide a **detailed description** of the alleged violation and/or the health or safety hazard you perceive

Background: The Ordinance applies to New Winery Applications and for existing wineries/tasting rooms that want to expand their rights to food service or hold wine trade events – which **requires a Use Permit Modification**. Community groups must report **hospitality uses that are not specified in a facility's current Use Permit** - Application for Modification required: County Counsel clarified that **all uses must be specified; there's no such thing as "silent permits" or "grandfathered rights."**
